- 3 The Board believes and research supports that students who attend school regularly are more successful
- 4 than those who do not. Students are responsible for attending class. The learning experiences that take
- 5 place in the classroom environment are an essential part of the educational process. Absences and
- 6 tardiness tend to disrupt the continuity of the instructional program and the time lost from class is
- 7 irretrievable, particularly in terms of opportunity for interaction and exchange of ideas between students
- 8 and teachers. Missing class hinders a student's ability to master the subject matter, and this may be
- 9 reflected in the grade. Grades earned in any course shall reflect the student's fulfillment of academic
- 10 requirements, achievement, and daily participation. The administration does not condone absences that
- 11 detract from our academics
- 12 A student's regular school attendance also reflects dependability and is a significant component on a
- 13 student's permanent record. Future employers are as much concerned about punctuality and
- dependability as they are about academic record. School success, scholarship, and job opportunity are
- 15 greatly affected by a good attendance record.
