- 3 Students are reminded that their appearance significantly affects the way others respond to them.
- 4 Matters of dress remain the primary responsibility of students, in consultation with their parents or legal
- 5 guardians. Personal appearance of a student shall be respected provided it does not interfere with the
- 6 health and safety of the student or others and does not materially disrupt the educational process. The
- 7 administration shall establish procedures for the monitoring of student dress in school or while engaging
- 8 in extracurricular activities. Specifics regarding this policy may be found in the individual building's
- 9 student handbook.
- 10 Students attending public events sponsored by the school district are permitted to honor their American
- 11 Indian heritage through the display of culturally significant tribal regalia. Any item that promotes drug
- use, weapons use, threats of violence, sexual harassment, bullying, or other intimidation, or violates
- another district policy, state, or federal law may not be worn at a public event sponsored by the school
