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- 2 Management of Sports Related Concussions
- 3 The District recognizes that concussions and head injuries are commonly reported injuries in children
- 4 and adolescents who participate in sports and other recreational activities. The Board acknowledges
- 5 the risk of catastrophic injuries or death is significant when a concussion or head injury is not properly
- 6 evaluated and managed. Therefore, all K-12 organized sports activities, as defined by state law, will
- 7 be identified for head injury management practices by the district administration.
- 8 Consistent with guidelines provided by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Centers
- 9 for Disease Control and Prevention, the National Federation of High School (NFHS) and the Montana
- 10 High School Association (MHSA), the District will utilize procedures developed by the MHSA and other
- 11 pertinent information to inform and educate coaches, athletic trainers, officials, youth athletes, and
- their parents and/or guardians of the nature and risk of concussions or head injuries, including the
- dangers associated with continuing to play after a concussion or head injury. Resources are available

17 Removal from Participation

- 18 An athletic trainer, coach, or official shall immediately remove from play, practice, tryouts, training
- 19 exercises, preparation for an athletic game, or sport camp any student-athlete who is suspected of
- sustaining a concussion or head injury or other serious injury.

21 Return to Play After Concussion or Head Injury

- 22 In accordance with MHSA Return to Play Rules and Regulations and The Dylan Steigers Protection of
- 23 Youth Athletes Act, a student athlete who has been removed from play, practice, tryouts, training
- 24 exercises, preparation for an athletic game, or sport camp may not return until the athlete is cleared
- by a licensed health care professional who specializes in concussion management and is under contract
- with the school district. This certified health care provider may be a volunteer.

27 Impact Testing

- As a component of the District's sports related concussion management procedures, the District will
- 29 utilize a neurocognitive computer-based test or other recognized neurocognitive testing program to
- 30 establish a baseline of short-term memory processing speed and reaction time. Post injury scores
- 31 should be comparable to the original baseline score and the student-athlete will be asymptomatic prior
- 32 to being released to continued participation. The Impact Testing will be initiated at the high school
- 33 level in all competitive sports activities.

34 Right to Deny Participation

- 35 The District reserves the right to deny student-athlete participation in practices or competitions as a
- preventative measure to further safeguard student health.
- 37 Information for Parents and Athletes
- 38 Annually, the district will distribute a head injury and concussion information and sign-off sheet to all
- 39 parents and guardians of student-athletes in competitive sport activities prior to the student-athlete's
- 40 initial practice or competition.

1 Training

- 2 All coaches, athletic trainers, officials, including volunteers participating in organized youth athletic
- activities, shall complete the training program at least once each school year as required in the District
- 4 procedure. Additionally, all coaches, athletic trainers, officials, including volunteers participating in
- 5 organized youth athletic activities will comply with all procedures for the management of head injuries
- 6 and concussions.
