The District is not required to provide break time if to do so would 13 unduly disrupt the District's operations. Supervisors are encouraged to consider flexible 14 schedules when accommodating employees' needs. The Superintendent or designees are 15 authorized to work with teachers to provide students necessary time to express milk for a child. 16 17 The District shall make reasonable efforts to provide a room or other location, other than a toilet 18 stall, where an employee or student can express breast milk and access to a place to store 19 20 expressed breast milk safely. The available space will include the provision for lighting and electricity for the pump apparatus.
