Employee Accident Reporting and Workers' Compensation Benefits

All employees of the District are covered by Workers' Compensation benefits. In the event of an industrial accident, an employee should:

- 10 1. Attend to first aid and/or medical treatment as necessary;
- 11 2. Correct, or report the hazardous situation as soon as possible;
- Report the injury or disabling condition (whether actual or possible) to the immediate supervisor
 - 4. Complete the District's Accident/Injury Report as soon as possible, but no later than 48 hours.

- 17 The immediate supervisor shall notify the Human Resource Office of the report as soon as
- possible. The Human Resource Office will notify the Transportation/Safety Office of the report.

 Should the employee require time off of work due to the injury, the supervisor must notify
- Human Resources immediately in order to comply with offering any eligible leave benefits,
- 21 including Family Medical Leave (FMLA). The return to work of an employee must also be
- 22 coordinated through the Human Resource Office.
- 23 An employee who is injured in an industrial accident may be eligible for Workers' Compensation
- benefits. By law, use of sick leave must be coordinated with receipt of Workers' Compensation
- benefits on a case-by-case basis by contacting the MTSBA/MSGIA Workers' Compensation
- 26 Risk Retention Program (WCRR).

- 28 The District will not automatically and simply defer to a report of industrial accident. The
- 29 District shall investigate as it deems appropriate to determine (1) whether continuing hazardous
- 30 conditions exist that need to be eliminated, and (2) whether in fact an accident attributable to the
- 31 District's working environment did occur as reported. The District may require the employee to
- 32 provide pertinent medical information to the District or to a physician of the District's choice,
- 33 should an actual-claim be filed against the MTSBA/MSGIA Compensation Risk Retention
- Program which could result in additional fees levied against the District.
